Elogio de la Sombra Jorge Luis Borges, 2005-08-01 La vejez (tal es el nombre que otros le dan) / puede ser el tiempo de nuestra dicha. / El animal ha muerto o casi ha muerto. / Quedan el hombre y el alma.. Con estos versos Jorge Luis Borges inicia el poema Elogio de la sombra que da título a este volumen. En su prólogo escribe: A los espejos, laberintos y espadas que ya preve mi resignado lector se han agregado dos temas nuevos: la vejez y la ética... Este libro reúne las composiciones en prosa y en verso escritas entre 1967 y 1969. Su publicación celebró los 70 años del autor y tuvo una gran acogida entre el público y la crítica. Elogio de la sombra es la plenitud de Borges, su retorno a las cosas esenciales, escribió Félix Luna. A la edad que tiene Borges, cuando el animal ha muerto o casi ha muerto, queda de lo más importante, es decir, el espíritu puro y las raíces. Entre estos dos límites extremos, su penumbra; esa sombra que 'se parece a la eternidad.

The Making of Jorge Luis Borges as an Argentine Cultural Icon Mariana Casale O’Ryan, 2014-05-05 Jorge Luis Borges is, undeniably, Argentina's best-known and most influential writer. In addition to scholarly studies of his work, his emblematic figure continues to appear on book covers and carrier bags, in biographies, plaques and statues, photographs and interviews, as well as cartoons and city tours. *The Making of Jorge Luis Borges as an Argentine Cultural Icon* argues that the ideas and expectations that Argentine people have placed upon the author - thus constructing the icon - are also those that allow them to define their cultural identity. The book examines these intertwined processes by analysing the image of Borges in biographies, photographs, comic strips and urban spaces and the socio-political, historical and cultural contexts in which they were produced. The study seeks not to reveal a Borgesian essence but, rather, to expose the complexity of the ongoing mechanisms which construct Borges the icon. Despite the vast amount of biographical and critical work about the writer that has been produced in Argentina and abroad, *The Making of Jorge Luis Borges as an Argentine Cultural Icon* is the first in-depth, comprehensive examination of the construction of the author as an Argentine cultural icon.

Transcultural Joyce Karen Lawrence, 1998-08-13 In *Transcultural Joyce*, a team of leading international scholars assess

the afterlife of James Joyce and his writings within a multinational context. How does Joyce haunt the works of later writers in diverse literary traditions? How well does he translate from one culture and language to another? This book considers Joyce's reincarnations in texts from Latin America, Europe, and South Asia. Transcultural Joyce provides a fresh theoretical examination of conventional notions such as 'influence' and 'translation' and asks how Joyce is imported across particular cultural boundaries. As a canonical modernist and colonial subject, Joyce inhabits a borderline position that complicates his reception and revision by later writers. This book accounts for his cultural place as specifically Irish and more postcolonial than previous studies have acknowledged. Scholars and translators of Joyce also consider the formidable task of translating his work for a global audience.

Volume 12, Tome V: Kierkegaard's Influence on Literature, Criticism and Art Jon Stewart, 2016-12-05 While Kierkegaard is primarily known as a philosopher or religious thinker, his writings have also been used extensively by literary

writers, critics and artists. This use can be traced in the work of major cultural figures not just in Denmark and Scandinavia but also in the wider world. They have been attracted to his creative mixing of genres, his complex use of pseudonyms, his rhetoric and literary style, and his rich images, parables, and allegories. The present volume documents this influence in the different language groups and traditions. Tome V treats the work of a heterogeneous group of writers from the Romance languages and from Central and Eastern Europe. Kierkegaard has been particularly important for Spanish literature: the Argentine writers Jorge Luis Borges, Leonardo Castellani, and Ernesto Sábato, the Mexican writer Carlos Fuentes, and the Spanish essayist and philosopher María Zambrano were all inspired to varying degrees by him. The Dane also appears in the work of Romanian writer Max Blecher, while the Portuguese author Fernando Pessoa was almost certainly inspired by Kierkegaard's use of pseudonyms. Kierkegaard has also influenced diverse literary figures from Central and Eastern Europe. His influence appears in the novels of the contemporary Hungarian authors Péter Nadas and Péter Esterházy, the work of the Russian writer and literary critic, Mikhail Bakhtin, the Polish writer Witold Gombrowicz and the Czech novelist Ivan Klíma. Tome V also examines how Kierkegaard's treatment of the story of Abraham and Isaac in *Fear and Trembling* interested the Polish-born Israeli novelist Pinhas Sadeh.

The idea for the book grew out of the experience and fieldwork of the authors, who lived with Indo-Caribbean devotees of the Hindu Goddess in Guyana. Using a variety of discursive forms including oral history and testimony, field notes, songs, stories, poems, literary essays, photographic illustrations, and personal and theoretical reflections, it explores the cultural, aesthetic and spiritual aspects of the Goddess in a diasporic and cross-cultural context. With reference to critical and cultural theorists including Walter Benjamin and Julia Kristeva, the possibilities offered by Kali (and other manifestations of the Goddess) as the site of translation are discussed in the works of such writers as Wilson Harris, V.S. Naipaul and R.K. Narayan. The book articulates perspectives on the experience of living through displacement and change while probing the processes of translation involved in literature and ethnography and postulating links between 'rite' and 'write,' Hindu 'leela' and creole 'play.' The author wrote the description of the Big Puja (namely chapter 9, 10, 11, and 13) and the Guyana Kali Puja Lexicon (chapter 17) in collaboration with Guyanese scholar Karna Singh.
